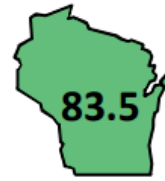

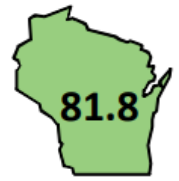
State Report Card Score
