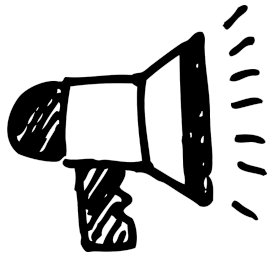

Enrollment and Course Selection

New students, both resident and non-resident, must complete the “New Student Online Enrollment” in Skyward prior to registration. This is located on the front page of the district website, HHASD.org. Please contact the Friess Lake Elementary School office at 262-628-2380 with questions.

Registration is currently open for both residents and non-residents. Online registration will close on June 4th.

Once your child’s enrollment application is approved, please follow the instructions to select your Summer School courses.

Summer School Course Selection Instructions

1. Log into Skyward Family Access
2. Click on “Arena Scheduling” to choose classes (course codes are listed under the class column).
3. Click "Add" on desired courses.
4. Proceed to the “Fee Management” tab to process payment for your selected courses. Your child’s place in the selected courses will not be secured until the fees have been processed through “Fee Management”.
5. You will receive a confirmation email for each course your child has registered for.

Course Selection and Term Length

Courses will be filled according to the order in which registrations are received. In the Skyward system, families will be notified immediately if a course has reached capacity. Students completing the paper-and-pencil form will be notified if courses have reached capacity. The grade level indicated in each course refers to the grade students will enter in the 2020-21 school year. Each course runs for the full length of summer school, unless otherwise noted.

Fees and Payment

The fees for summer school are determined on a per student/per course basis. All students must pay fees for courses requiring additional materials as indicated in the course catalog. All fees must be paid in full in order to complete registration. Payments can be made via the Skyward online portal or by check made out to the Holy Hill Area School District. All checks must be turned in to the Holy Hill Area School District office. All non-resident students must pay an additional \$75, per student, fee unless students are open enrolled into HHASD. The HHASD office is located at 3117 Highway 167, Richfield WI, 53076.

Refunds

Refunds will only be issued in the event of a course cancellation. Registration changes must be made prior to June 4th, 2020. No refunds will be made after June 4th, 2020.

Program Policies

HHASD’s summer school program utilizes all school district rules and policies, including behavior. These guidelines can be found on the district website. The district reserves the right to dismiss participants who do not abide by the policies. The HHASD Student Conduct Policies can be found in the HHASD handbook or online at HHASD.org.

YMCA Summer Camp

The Holy Hill Area School District works alongside the Kettle Moraine YMCA to provide summer programming to area students. This year, the Kettle Moraine YMCA will coordinate a summer camp program that runs from June 8th - August 28th. Cost of the program is listed in the YMCA Summer Camp Brochure. Many of the traditional activities from past summer school programs will be incorporated into the YMCA Summer Camp, leaving families with many options to choose from for summer activities.

Students may enroll in summer camp and summer school simultaneously. Students in summer school may register for any combination of courses offered and are not required to attend the full three hour session. Students are allowed to move to-and-from summer camp to attend their summer school courses. Student enrollment in YMCA camp may vary from week-to-week and families will be charged accordingly.
